would admit of, and I should think that the  
General Government would not dream of  
paying less than we did.

It was not to be expected, that the State  
could furnish the militia on all occasions, on as  
reasonable terms as the United States could the  
regular troops. though I believe it will  
turn out to appear that they were. I am  
happy to know that Mr. H. after an  
examination of about six months, has  
been able to find fault in any manner  
with our accounts. He is an able and  
faithful officer, and if it should be  
approved of by him, it may be said  
that it has passed the ordeal indeed.
