Dec. 10. 1819

Dear Sir

I do myself the pleasure to inform you, that your account has been passed by the Executive for five hundred and fifty eight dollars, and that one hundred and seventy five dollars have been directed to be paid to you out of the two hundred and thirty nine dollars that remain of the appropriation unexpended in part of your account. you can therefore draw on the cashier of the Farmers' Bank at Annapolis for one hundred and twenty five dollars - fifty Dollars having been deducted by me to reimburse me for what I advanced to you - The balance of your account cannot be paid until the Legislature has provided for it.
