My dear Sir,

The Executive have directed me to inform you, that they have selected you to examine into the state of the Armoury at London. They will therefore esteem it a favour if you will be pleased to state to them the number of arms that are in the Armoury, the number that appear to want cleaning, and what you suppose would be a reasonable compensation to any person for putting them in order. The Executive cannot without aid fix with certainty on a particular compensation to be given to the person who may be employed by them to clean them.
