Gentlemen.

For the information of the Senate and House of Delegates I have the honor to transmit a duplicate of an account examined and passed by the Auditor, exhibiting a statement of the expenditures by me under two Resolutions passed at the last Session, appropriating certain sums of money for furnishing and repairing the Government House. It is proper to observe that altho' the appropriations were distinct, I found it impossible to keep the expenditures entirely separate; and therefore they are presented in one view. Of the five thousand dollars appropriated, there remains unexpended the sum of \$1642. 81/4. The various articles of furniture purchased & items of expenditures will appear from the vouchers filed with the Auditor. I would respectfully suggest that it might be advisable, without delay, to appoint a committee to take an inventory of the Furniture now belonging to the House. In the meantime Mr. John Shaw will be requested to take charge of it.
