Information having been received by the Executive Department of the State of Maryland, that a certain William Carpenter indicted in Baltimore City Court, in the said State of Maryland, of fraudulently receiving sundry Bank Notes the property of the President, Directors and company of the Mechanic's Bank of Baltimore knowing that the said Notes had been feloniously stolen by a certain John Lewis and that the said William Carpenter is at this time residing, in the State of Ohio. In order therefore that the said William Carpenter may be brought to justice, I have in the name of the Executive authority of the State of Maryland to request that your Excellency will cause the said William Carpenter to be arrested and secured so that he may be delivered up to Mr. George F. Albert, Junior whom I have appointed Agent to receive him and to remove him to this State. Enclosed you will receive a copy of the Indictment duly authenticated...
