Gentlemen

We send to the General Assembly, sundry resolutions adopted by the Legislatures of the States of Tennessee, Vermont and New Jersey, in relation to certain proposed alterations of the Constitution of the United States. Also a letter from J. P. Duward, containing a proposal to furnish the State with arms; together with a letter from William A. Museum, enclosing a law of Congress respecting the rules and regulations for the field exercise and manoeuvres of infantry, compiled and adapted to the organization of the Army of the United States.

In the recep of the General Assembly, the Offices of Register of Wills, for Anne Arundel, Kent and Somerset Counties, became vacant, occasioned by the deaths of the former Incumbents. We filled up the above vacancies by appointing Thomas H. Hall, Esquire, for Anne Arundel County, Guthbert Hall, Esquire, for Kent County, and James Polk, Esquire, for Somerset County.
