Johnson whom I have appointed an Agent on the part of this State to receive and bring him into the State of Maryland, having jurisdiction of his crime, according to the provisions of the Constitution of the United States and the Act of Congress passed on the twelfth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety three.
