

To transmit, while it presents to the General Assembly the opportunity of immediately providing for the care and education of that unfortunate class of our citizens, may, it is hoped, suggest to them the propriety of establishing by law a similar institution in our own state. By referring to the reports of those states which have already taken this subject seriously into consideration, it will be discovered that the number of those unfortunate beings, in every instance, has been ascertained to exceed very greatly, any calculation which had been formed upon the subject - we therefore, cannot fail to convince that there has ~~been~~ <sup>been</sup> assisted by Divine Providence, will be found in a ratio in our own state, than has been accurately ascertained up to now, to exist in others. The advantages of an institution at home over any other mode which may be adopted for the relief of these unfortunate, will be found to exist, first in the superintending care of the legislature of the State over a permanent institution extending its benefits alike to the present and all future times; and secondly the retention and circulation within the limits of our own state, of the large sums of money, which would, under a different system be required to sustain and educate so large a number of pupils at any distant place. A common regard for the temporal and eternal welfare, of this class of our fellow beings, will dictate the humanity of some enactment upon the subject. Well aware that the feeling and wisdom of the legislature will be properly directed on any measure which they may think proper to adopt - we have the honour to remain.
