I have thought proper in the name of the Executive authority of the State of Maryland, in pursuance of the Constitution of the United States, and the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act respecting fugitives from justice and persons escaping from the service of their Masters," to demand of your Excellency the said Isaac Collins, alias Simon, as a fugitive from justice, and that he be delivered to Doctor John Rogers, whom I have appointed agent to receive the said Isaac Collins, alias Simon, and to remove him to this State having jurisdiction of the offence with which he is charged. For your Excellency's satisfaction I have enclosed you the affidavit on which this application is grounded.
