Sir

I have received information that Thomas Irwin, who has been charged by the affidavit of Bushrod W. Marriott, of stealing sundry Bank notes the property of the said B. W. Marriott has fled from Justice of this State, and is now confined in the Jail of Philadelphia in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It has devolved therefore on me in the name of the Executive Authority of the State of Maryland to demand of your Excellency (agreeably to the act of Congress passed on the 12th day of February 1793 respecting fugitives from Justice and persons escaping from the service of their Masters) the said Thomas Irwin, and to request that he be delivered to Mr. William O'Hara, who has been duly Appointed Agent on the part of the Executive Authority of the State of Maryland to receive and remove the said Thomas Irwin to this State, having Jurisdiction of the offence with which he is charged. For your Excellency's satisfaction, I have enclosed you the affidavit on which this application is grounded, which has been taken by the proper officer.
