Yours of the 2d inst came duly to hand and was submitted to the Executive in Amiel at their Office which has just terminated.

I have instructed to inform you that I had doubts as to the contents of the dispatch of your promotion in a Brigade General from testimony which has been submitted to the Executive in relation to Genl M Laughlin's conduct and I am glad that in consequence they have not proceeded to give the promotion you mention.

Communications were received this day after the adjournment of the Amiel from General M Laughlin and Col A. H. H. stating that Genl M had returned to Baltimore from the South resigning his position in the Army and claiming the command of the Brigade. These communications having been received after the adjournment of the Amiel I can say no more in consequence of them than to give you the fact of their reception.
