Sir, I enclose you a Commission for some in Captain Atlees Troop agreeably to your request in your letter of the Adjutant General bearing unto the 30th ulto.

The Executive were under the impression that the Commission requested for Basil Hayden Captain and the Officer of a Troop of Horse was for a new Troop.

It is necessary to enable us to keep a regular record of all Commissions and asked that it be distinctly stated, whether they are for a new Corp or in place of others, and in this latter case to state in what place each Officer is wanted, and what has become of the former, whether dead, resigned, moved away or how otherwise out of Commission. When this explanation is given no further difficulty will be experienced in obtaining the Commissions you desire.
