Sir,

His Excellency the Governor of this State has determined to make a demand upon His Excellency the Governor of Virginia of John Peter alias Turner, who has been committed by the Court of Stafford County to the Jail of said County upon a charge of murdering Miss Cunningham, a fugitive from the Justice of this State.

A Major Clarke the Agent appointed to receive and bring him to this State will be at Stafford Court for that purpose on the second Monday in August next. This delay is occasioned by an apprehension arising from the suggestion in your letter to Mr Sewall, that some difficulty might occur in obtaining the prisoner in the receipt of the Court and not being able to be in time for the Court in this Month.
