

Council Chamber Annapolis July 27 1825

Sir,

I have just received yours of the 25 Instant, by which I regret to learn that the Commissions sent you some time since have not been received. Upon reference to your letter recommending the appointments, I find it was mailed at Baltimore, and I find by referring to the copy of a letter accompanying the Commission that they were directed there.

I presumed my letter with the Commission and now in the office at Baltimore. It may be that the office at which they were directed may be mailed, unless otherwise directed. I enclose a copy of my letter sent with the Commission.

The 2d letter which you mentioned having written requesting the appointment of officers for the company lately commanded by Capt. Hugh Ely Capron has been received. Upon receipt of this, and examination of the post office at Baltimore the Commission was not obtained, and you will drop in a line to inform us, I will make out others and send them immediately.

Your last letter shall be laid before the Executive at their next meeting and if the Gentlemen named should be appointed their Commission shall be promptly made out and transmitted.
