Sir,

I am informed that your Excellency the Governor being at  
present in the State of Pennsylvania and not expected home before the

papers to enable you to accomplish the purpose of your journey. I have  
obtained from the Council such a document as I believe will satisfy the Executive  
of Virginia and may wait for his Excellency's signature to the papers which  
I have sent to his residence, when they will be transmitted to Richmond.  
Mr. Thompson will meet you in Fredericksburg or at Stafford Court.

I herewith transmit to your Excellency an official demand

the Agent appointed to receive him, with such authority as may be  
necessary to empower the said Agent to transport him to this State.
