Herewith transmit you a new demand upon the Governor of Virginia for the captured Murderer, accompanied by a deposition which I presume will remove all difficulties in obtaining him. I find upon an examination of the file of this office a demand made by the Council of Virginia in 1803 accompanied by depositions the authenticity of which is not certified by the Executive Authority of that State, nor the official character of the Magistrate who took them attested by anyone. You need not mention this fact unless a further difficulty occurs, which I do not anticipate.
