His Excellency the Governor of New York has determined to surrender to the British authorities a fugitive from Justice in compliance with a requisition issued notwithstanding the said fugitive has been imprisoned upon a charge of having committed an offence against the laws of this State. The Sheriff of Rattine County will be immediately instructed to deliver him to Wm. Kay your agent whose name he may appear to receive him, and at the same time furnished with a warrant of authority to be delivered to Mr. Kay as his authority, or safe passage for transporting the said prisoner to New York.
