I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 11th inst. in relation to the publication of the Journal of the General Assembly of the State of New York. I have the honor to inform you that the same has been forwarded to you as above.

Upon reflection and a more careful examination of the Constitution, I am satisfied that publication in the New York papers of the acts providing for a Convention, is not necessary to authorize the Journal of the Assembly at its next Session to publish them. The Constitution does not require that all the laws be published in the same manner as hath heretofore been used in this State. It seems to me that the publication meant by the Constitution is the printing and distributing the copies of the laws. This is the only mode in which the laws can be published. If this view of the matter be correct, it will not be necessary that the laws be published at the last Session providing for a Convention, in the Constitution, published in the New York papers, as none of them are of general interest, and the expense would be unnecessary.
