I have the pleasure of sending you a commission as State Wharfinger in the City of Baltimore. It is by direction of the Governor and Council you are hereby authorized and directed, after giving Bond and qualifying as required by Law, to take charge of all the Wharves belonging to the State within the City of Baltimore, and the Wharf of the Public Wharves East Street, reserved to the use of the Citizens of this State, and to proceed to perform the several duties required of you by Law, and to deposit monthly in the Bank of Baltimore the amount of Wharfage which you are required by Law to deposit to the credit of the Treasurer of the Western Shore.

Gentlemen,

In the provisions of Law act to amend the Story System, which was passed at the last Session of the General Assembly, the Commissioners before proceeding to act, are required to give Bond as therein prescribed with a proviso that those who had previously Bonded might continue to act until the first Monday of May next, and before which time they are required to renew their Bond as required by the said Act, in case of their failure the Treasurers are directed to make their appointments in their stead. Mr. Hall has given his Bond, and I am instructed to inform you that the Treasurers will meet again on the first Monday of May next, at which time they will not be in Office.
