By direction of the Governor and Council, you are requested,  
to give them your opinion whether a Bond given by the Register in Thomas  
(whose appointment is required to be annually made) in conformity with the  
Act of 1823 Chapter 195, which requires his Bond to be renewed annually  
yearly, will be obligatory upon the parties to such Bond for the performance  
of duty, after a subsequent re-appointment of Register, and whether, with  
respect to every Officer, requires to give Bond for the faithful performance  
of duty, a new Bond is not necessary after a re-appointment.

The Executive will be in Session again on the first Monday  
in May, and it is desirable that they should have your opinion by that time.
