said Army. Your communication was referred to me, Auditor, the Officer having
charge of the Military Records, the Revolutionary Army who reports that it
would be a work of much labour and difficulty to comply with your request, and
would require the copying of a large mass of Papers, but that upon being furnished
with a list of applicants, in the benevolent view of the Government upon applications being
made individual who may claim to come within its provisions, will promptly
furnish such evidence as the records in his charge will afford, which he has already
done in a number of instances.

Your letter to His Excellency the Governor of the 24th of July last
