Sir,

Your letter of the 11th inst. addressed to the Secretary of the Governor was not received until after the Council had adjourned and consequently was not acted on.

Some time past Col. Hitchcock recommended the promotion of Captain John B. Paine Major and stated that he had the best recommendation of a Captain in the Regiment under his command. The following is an extract from a letter which I addressed to Col. Hitchcock on the 14th ultimo (viz. William H. Cutshaw) in regard to the promotion of the Captain holding the best recommendation being appointed Oct. 16th 1828 and John B. Paine on the 11th of the following June. The Executive declined appointing the Major until they had further from you after receiving the foregoing information. Nothing further has yet been heard from Col. Hitchcock upon the subject. Your letter will be laid before the Council when they next meet.
