Sir,

Yours of yesterday was handed to me by W. Wilcox this morning and I send you herewith and send a commission of witnesses within the City of Baltimore.

Your appointment has been made in a name different from any other that have any interest in it, and I believe, after making pretty full enquiry that none other was made in the same way by the Executive of this State. Under these circumstances, His Excellency felt considerable reluctance and difficulty in granting the commission, but as you were so very desirous of having it, and as no person but yourself can suffer on account of the irregularity of the proceeding, with the Court being determined illegal, he concluded to gratify your wishes.
