The Executive are desirous of having the Tobacco inspection Warehouses insured against loss by fire, and have instructed me to cause such insurance to be effected upon the best terms obtainable in Baltimore.

The Warehouse purchased from William Sheppard, was at the time under insurance in the equitable Office; but whether the policy is now out, or when it will be, I am not informed. It is not known whether the Warehouse obtained from William & Bidwell was under insurance or not. Will you please ascertain and inform me as soon as convenient, whether any, and if any, which, if the Warehouse are under insurance, and when the policy or policies will expire, and
