Sir,

Yours of the 15th inst was duly received and submitted to the Executive at the late meeting and I received instructions to inform you that the State has not yet sent any Rifle to Loan. I understood in the course of last year that the officers of several Rifle Companies intended to return their Arms, but none have as yet been received. I cannot inform you when a quota of Arms will be received from the United States. The usual course has been for the Engineer Department whenever a number of Arms deemed proper for distribution are on hand to ascertain the quota of each State and inform the respective State Executives thereof, and authorize them to draw for their respective quotas. It is about two years since such a distribution was made and the last previous way in 1822.
