To the Justices of the Lay Court  
of Prince George's County.

Quib.

The Governor and Council have received a copy of certain proceedings of the Lay Court of Prince George's County, purporting to designate the places at which Warehouses should be kept for the receipt and inspection of Tobacco in said County, the number of Inspectors at each Warehouse, and the number of days in each week the several Inspectors shall be required to attend, and how in acting and receiving duties to those of Inspectors at said Warehouses.

Upon examination of the said copy of your proceedings it appears that some of the requisitions of the Law under which they were made have not been complied with, - that you omitted to designate the number of Inspectors at each Warehouse, and also the number of days in each week the several Inspectors shall be required to attend and to sign your names to said Copy.

That your Jurors, I am instructed to inform you and demand so material a departure from the express requirements of the Law, that they decline making the appointments recommended, and request that you will immediately cause to be transmitted to them a communication in compliance with the requisitions of the Law.
