

the all and sundry Resolutions of a character to demand the attention of the National Government? The reply was, immediately communicated to the General Assembly, and being deemed an explicit refusal to afford the aid of the General Government in accomplishing the contemplated survey and improvement, no further steps were taken in relation thereto.

The passage of the Resolutions transmitted to the President, was the subject of the General Assembly upon the subject of them. An appropriation was made to defray any expenses that might be incurred in making the contemplated survey and these views of the same character having heretofore been made by authority of the National Government without any expense or aid of the States, it is confidently believed that the arrangement which you mention does not come within the views of the Legislature. It is certain that no authority had been conferred upon the Executive to carry such an arrangement into effect.
