I have just received a letter from Littleton (Charles) Esq. in which the following is contained: "By the death of Major Boyer, of the 11th Cavalry Regiment, a vacancy occurred, which should and should have been supplied, and I am requested to recommend for that appointment, Lieut. James W. Jones, of the Prince George's Company. You were a Delegate for this County for December Term 1829, and I would be glad to have you please to advise Mr. Jones, at Baltimore, upon this subject, as he is desirous of being informed before the meeting of the Executive."

In compliance with Mr. Jones's request, I have to state to you that no appointment has yet been made to supply the vacancy in the Cavalry occasioned by the death of Major Boyer.

I presume you are aware that in making military appointments the Executive have regard to grade, and, consequently, usually promote to any vacancy that occurs, the Officer next below in the same Corps. To ensure your appointment to the vacancy occasioned by the death of Major Boyer, I presume it will be necessary to obtain the recommendation of the Colonel of the Regiment, and a waiver of the claims of the Company Officers, or satisfactory evidence of their unfitness for the Station.
