Annapolis June 13th 1831.

Sir, I have received yours of the 9th Instant covering a communication from you to the Governor and Council soliciting the appointment of Gauger in Baltimore in the place of Gabriel Thomas decd.

Mr Thomas died before the last meeting of the Governor and Council, at which applications were made to appoint another in his place, but there was also at the same time, communication from a large number of the dealers in liquor and before them, strongly remonstrating against any appointment being made in his place, and alleging that there, ever now, more than enough to transact the business. Upon these representations the Governor and Council determined not to make any appointment.

From what I have stated above you will perceive there is little or no probability of any appointment of Gauger being made to supply the place of Mr Thomas. I shall nevertheless lay your letter before the Governor and Council at their next meeting, which will be on the third Thursday of next month, and I shall now in all otherwise direct.
