Dear Sir,

The Laws and Votes and proceedings of the last General Assembly sent to the several Counties, were, as usual, put up by the printer and sent, made by him and sent with them, of the different persons entitled to them. Upon the receipt of your letter & sent to Mr Green, and he requests me to say to you that if the list sent does not show that you are entitled to a copy, it is owing to an accidental omission of his.

You are unquestionably, entitled to a copy, and I presume Mr Gibson will not hesitate to deliver it to you upon being apprised of the error of the list not showing you entitled to it. It was found this Spring that the number contracted for by the General Assembly was not sufficient for the supply of all the Offices in Commission, and in consequence thereof I addressed a letter to each Clerk, stating the part of the deficiency, and requesting them not to deliver copies to any person in Commission, but those who qualify. We have retained no copies but those required for the Library and to be sent to other States &c.
