In August last Colo Keel transmitted to the Executive a letter addressed by you to him giving the names of certain Gentlemen whom you state had been selected Officers in the Troop under your command, and requested commissions for them. Colo Keel having neglected to report to the Adjutant General as required by Resolution of the General Assembly General Joseph Robinson had sometime previously recommended that Colo Jacob G Casies, late of the Artillery, be appointed to the command of the fifth Cavalry district. Upon referring to the list furnished by the Adjutant General of Officers who had reported, it was found that none of the Officers of the fifth Cavalry except yourself and Adjutant Purse had reported. Under these circumstances the Executive deferred making any appointments for the Regiment, and at their recent meeting instructed me to communicate the foregoing facts to the parties concerned, with a view to elicit such further representations as may enable them at their next meeting to act finally upon the subject, with all proper information before them.
