in cost of a scabbard of gold, silver or leather. The price of the
swords will be finally fixed after we hear from you in reply to this.
We have not been furnished with any design of Capt. Gallaghers
sword. You will be left (by the advice of Doctor Rug) (these names)
to exercise your own judgment and taste. The price of the Captains
sword will be not less than \$300 nor more than \$500. The other
may be more than the highest sum.
