Above you have a draft on the State Treasury for \$400 on account of the swords you are making for Colo Lawson and Captain Gallagher. Governor Thomas directs me to say to you that the limit for the cost of the swords, including appropriate scabbards, is \$1200 or \$700 for Colo Lawson; and \$500 for Captain Gallagher in the scabbard of Colo Lawson to be of silver. As you have had the advantage of an interview with Captain Gallagher, and of understanding his views, you are left at liberty to conform entirely to his wishes and your own judgment and taste in the style finish & of the sword for him.

It is expected, of course, that both swords will in all respects be equal to what you can fairly and reasonably afford to make them, for the prices stipulated.
