Sir

It is made my duty by the Resolutions
of the General Assembly of Maryland which I have the honour
to enclose to communicate with your Excellency upon the subject
of the Boundary between the States of Delaware, Pennsylvania and
Maryland -

It appears that the first Boundary Stone of Mason
& Dixon's line, which should stand at the North Eastern corner of
the State of Maryland, at the point where the States of Delaware,
Pennsylvania & Maryland join each other, has been removed,
lost, or destroyed, and it is the desire of the State of Maryland
that this point should by agreement with the States of Delaware
& Pennsylvania be ascertained and a permanent Stone or
Boundary erected to mark its location -

Your Excellency will perceive that the
enclosed resolutions suggest the appointment of a Commissioner
or Agent by each State to effect this object -

If this suggestion should not accord with
the views of your Excellency you will oblige me by indi-
cating any other manner more agreeable to you by which
the object of the State of Maryland can be effected -
