

The Governor has issued the following circular to the several Counties who are indebted for balances remaining unpaid at the Treasury according to the returns made by the Treasurers the 1<sup>st</sup> May 1849.

In conformity to the provisions of the act of Assembly the Treasurer has related to me that you as collector of the Direct Tax in \_\_\_\_\_ County owe for the year \_\_\_\_\_ a sum equal to the amount due by you, and that the balance standing against you on the books of the Treasury on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of May last, was \$ \_\_\_\_\_ exclusive of interest.
