

Depositions taken at the town of Elkton, Cecil County, Maryland,
on the 15th day of March 1851, before George H. Joyce Esq; a Justice of the
Peace, of the State aforesaid, in and for the said County, in the presence, and
under the supervision of Edward M. Wise, Special agent, appointed for that
purpose, by his Excellency the Governor, in the matter of the requisition of
J. S. Mitchell his Excellency the Governor of Pennsylvania, for the delivery of a certain
James S. Mitchell of said County, who stands charged in the State last
aforesaid, with the crime of Kidnapping.

Alexander Maxwell, a competent Witness of lawful age, being
produced on the part of the said J. S. Mitchell, and duly sworn upon the holy
Evangel of Almighty God, deposeth and saith, That, sometime last summer, a man
arrived in the town of Elkton, calling himself a Mr Alberti, having in his
charge and custody, a negro Woman and her child, claimed as slaves by James
S. Mitchell of Cecil County, and that this deponent accompanied the said Alberti
to the said Mitchell's residence, and upon their arrival there, the said
Mitchell was at home, and returned with the said Alberti, and this deponent,
to the said town of Elkton. The said negro Woman and child, were left
at the said town of Elkton, until the said Mitchell, Alberti and this deponent
returned; and this deponent has no knowledge, of any other negro Woman or
child having been brought to the said town for the said Mitchell.

John J. Hanes, a competent Witness of lawful age, being produced
on the part of the said J. S. Mitchell, and duly sworn, on the Holy Evangel
of Almighty God, deposeth and saith,
1st That Mr J. S. Mitchell, was not personally present in Pennsylvania,
(neither was he engaged to the best of his knowledge and belief,) either as
principal or accessory, in the enticement, seizure, or transportation out
of said State, of the said boy, Joel Henry Thompson.
2nd That this deponent was present, with Mr James S. Mitchell, in Elkton,
on the day that the said fugitive slave Woman, and her child, were brought
to this town, that the said Woman Betsey, recognized and acknowledged
Mr James S. Mitchell, as her master, and that the boy Joel Henry
Thompson, (acknowledging that to be his name) was her son.
