An Act

For running & marking the Boundary line between the
State of Virginia & Maryland. Passed March 3rd 1834

Whereas the General Assembly of Maryland has passed an
Act for running & marking the Boundary line between that
State & the State of Virginia, beginning therefor at the Fairfax
Stone on the Potomac River, sometimes called the North Branch
& the Potomac river, at or near its source and running thence
due North to the line of the State of Pennsylvania, and where-
as the Legislature of the State of Maryland has requested the
appointment of a Commissioner on the part of this State to act
in conjunction with the Commissioner of Maryland to run
& mark the said line; Therefore

Be it enacted by the General Assembly that the Govern-
or and he is hereby authorized and required to appoint a
Commissioner who together with the Commissioner who may be
appointed on the part of Maryland shall cause the said
line to be accurately surveyed, traced and marked with suit-
able monuments thereon at the said Fairfax's Stone situated
as aforesaid and running thence due North to the line of
the State of Pennsylvania.

It shall be the duty of the Commissioners, after running,
locating, establishing & marking the said line, to make a
Report, setting forth all the facts touching the same and
to forward Copies of the joint report to their respective Legis-
latures, & upon the ratification of such Report by the Legis-
latures of the States of Virginia & Maryland, the said
Boundary line shall be fixed & established to remain
forever, unless changed by mutual Consent of the said States
This Act shall be in force from its passage.
