Gentlemen:

The President and Directors of the  
Inland Valley and Jonsontown Turnpike Company  
incorporated Jan. 25. 1858 Chap 24 have by a memorial  
addressed to me notified me that they have perfected  
the said road for a distance of two and a half miles  
and that said portion is ready for inspection by Inspec-  
tors to be appointed by the Governor according to the pro-  
visions of the 13<sup>th</sup> Sect of said Act; and have asked  
me to appoint three skilfull and judicious persons  
to examine and inspect said portion so that upon their  
Report I may be enabled to act as the Law requires.

I have therefore nominated and appointed  
you to inspect and examine said Road so far as  
completed and I request that you will at once pro-  
ceed together to discharge this duty and report to me  
as soon as you have satisfied yourselves of its con-  
dition

Dear Sir

There are for trial at  
the present term of the Circuit Court for Harford County  
an unusual number of persons charged with high  
crimes, the most of whom are not citizens of this  
County but desperadoes from other Counties, other States  
and other Nations who have committed crimes here.  
There are no less than four indictments for murder  
now pending and none of the parties charged with that  
offence are citizens of this County.

Under these circumstances I conceive it to be  
not only right but my duty to request your Excellency  
to appoint some one to assist me in the prosecution  
of some of these cases, and I therefore hope your Excel-  
lency will appoint some competent lawyer to assist  
in the prosecution of John Montgomery and John Bernad  
now under indictment here for the murder of Jacob  
Nichols on the 20<sup>th</sup> of October last. I respectfully  
suggest the appointment of Mr. Am. E. H. Webster.

I am aware that the Court could and would  
appoint me an Assistant if I were to ask it
