1st A check of J. J. Atkinson dated 18th July 1860 No. 1988 on the Merchants Bank to the order of the State of Maryland for seventeen thousand five hundred and eleven dollars and twenty cents drawn by the Treasurer of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company.

2nd A note signed by J. W. Garrett, President and J. J. Atkinson, Treasurers of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company, by which that Company promise to pay to the State of Maryland on order \$18,511.20, payable 29th September 1860 without grace at the Merchants Bank of Baltimore, to C. I.

3rd A Certificate No. 571 of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company to the State of Maryland for \$205,680, bearing interest from 1st June 1857 at 6 per Cent (interest endorsed thereon, paid up to the 1st June 1860) payable half-yearly till the 1st June 1862 inclusive, after which the Certificate shall be counted into stock of the Company at par, and issued in pursuance of a resolution of the Board of Directors of the said Company passed 14th December 1856 and dated 10th January 1857.
