1st A check of J. J. Atkinson dated 18th July 1860
No. 1988 on the Merchants Bank to the order of
the State of Maryland for eighteen thousand
five hundred and eleven dollars and twenty
cents, drawn by the Treasurer of the Baltimore
and Ohio Rail Road Company.

2nd A note signed by J. W. Garrett, President
and J. J. Atkinson, Treasurer of the Baltimore
and Ohio Rail Road Company, by which
that Company promises to pay to the State
of Maryland on or before \$18,511.20, payable 29th

Bank of Baltimore, No. 21.

3rd A Certificate No. 571 of the Baltimore and
Ohio Rail Road Company to the State of Maryland
for \$205,680, bearing interest from 1st June 1857
at 6 per cent (interest endorsed thereon, paid up
to the 1st June 1860) payable half-yearly till
the 1st June 1862 inclusive, after which the
Certificate shall be counted into stock of the
Company at par, and issued in pursuance
of a resolution of the Board of Directors of the said
Company passed 17th December 1856 and dated
18th January 1857.
