 In pursuance of the Requisition of the President of the
 United States of the 15th of April addressed to me through the
 War Department and your communication of the 18th
 of the same month, I have issued orders to Brigadier Gen-
 eral John R. Kelly of the Third Brigade Maryland Militia
 (Baltimore) to take command of the four Regiments M. M.
 which I have ordered to be called out, to be mustered into
 the service of the United States. Brigadier General Kelly
 will report to the Adjutant General of the Army of the United
 States at Washington for such orders and instructions as
 may be issued.
