Resolutions

Resolved by the Senate and House of Delegates of the State of Maryland, "That the Constitution of the United States, so admirably framed by the wisdom of our forefathers, is recognized by the people of Maryland as the great charter of their liberties, the foundation, support and protection of their rights, and the main source of all their prosperity; that they are at all times ready cordially to renew the expression of their devotion to its principles; that they unreservedly acknowledge
