

a difficulty in the way of an immediate appointment of Collector of Taxes, that according to your invariable custom your County Tax is not made until June, and that if you were to appoint a Collector before that time you would not know how to regulate the remission of his Bond &c. Now you concur, it seems to me, the Collector of County and State Taxes and the apparent difficulty you suggest exists only from this confusion. There is no necessary connection whatever between the two offices - you can appoint the Collector of your County Tax at any time the County authorities may deem most convenient, nor does it give right to interfere in this appointment though you may delay it ever so long - But the Acts of Assembly require that the Collector of the State Tax should be appointed by a given day, and if not then appointed it is made the duty of the Governor to provide such a Collector.

The object is that the revenue for the year should be collected and paid into the Treasury without loss of time, and the difficulties you suggest when considered in this connection do not at all apply; for we know that \$54 in the hundred Dollars is required to be levied for the State Tax and the amount of penalty can be easily ascertained when you ascertain the whole amt of the State Tax for your County which can be done at once by referring to the amt of the assessed value of the property of the County.

I hope therefore your Commissioners will lose no time in levying this amt of State Tax and appointing some one to collect it - The time is already past when it is made my duty to appoint, and I must exercise the power unless the Commissioners do so very shortly.
