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A copy of the following Circular was sent this day to the Commissioners of the several Counties to whom the first County Rolls received by the Governor were sent, with authority to draw on the Treasury for the amount required to pay the bounties due on them.

Accompanying this you will receive a certified Roll of volunteers from your Co., mustered into the service of the United States, with an authority thereto annexed, for you to draw upon the Treasury of the State for the amount required to pay said volunteers the cash and monthly payments provided by the County Act of this State recently passed.

The Draft to be signed by you is endorsed on said authority, upon presentation of which at the Treasury, together with said roll be, you will be paid said amt. You will retain a copy of said Roll.

The Forms of the Vouchers to be taken by you on disbursement of said Bounty have been prepared, printed and put together in a book, for which, you will please direct your Messenger to call at this Department, when he presents said Draft at the Treasury.
