Note. Dr. John J. Moran of Frederick County was first appointed Examining Surgeon of Drafted men in that County and after several weeks employed in that service complaints were made of his corrupt practices in granting exemptions; he was arrested on that account by the Government, and the Governor of Maryland after causing an examination to be made as to the truth of these charges, deemed it essentially necessary that the exemptions granted by that Surgeon should be set aside and a re-examination made of the whole number of Applicants. The Draft was then about to take place and it was important that this Surgical re-examination should be made with the utmost promptness and by Surgeons of acknowledged character and skill. The Governor appointed for this purpose the 3 Surgeons above named; they resided in the City of Baltimore, and it was only on his urgent solicitation that they consented, on short notice, to leave their professional pursuits in that City, where they were in full practice, and to repair to Frederick County for the
