Dear Sir:

At my first interview with Judge French after my return from the West where I have been for about 2 months, he informed me that no plat of land laid out for a Soldiers Cemetery near Sharpsburg, had been received by you. I forwarded one more than six months ago and regret that it did not reach you.

When you were at Sharpsburg it was suggested that some desirable alterations might be made in the location of some of the lines as then surveyed. At a subsequent meeting of Mr. Henry myself and others interested, for that purpose, it was ascertained that no changes could be made that would be at all desirable, consequently none was made, except a slight one of the Western line so as to include precisely 10 acres.

Mr. Henry has been furnished with a copy of the courses for the purpose of executing a Deed. I am attending Court as a witness and as soon as I am discharged I will forward you another plat of the land as located.
