

*Letter from Capt. John W. Ringrove to Brigade Major
Watkins, relative to Arms.*

[Filed December 4th, 1829.]

LISBON, November 29. 1829.

DEAR SIR—Yours of the 23^d Sept ult. together with a Copy of a Resolution of the General Assembly, is before me. The only apology I can offer for not answering it according to your request is, my being absent from home.

I have bonded to the State for Arms, as follows, all which is now in my possession:—Two Iron Cannon, Six Pounders, mounted—but when received was, and is yet, in very bad order, and without the necessary equipage—and Twenty-seven Swords, with Iron Scabbards, without Belts.
