Shewing the highest returns of the MILITIA of MARYLAND, which have been received at the Adjutant Generals Department, from each of the counties and the city of Baltimore, and comparing them with the returns of election for President and Vice President of the United States in the year 1828, and shewing the excess in each, and also, the probable deficiency in the return of the whole Militia.
