here it is to be used, and prepared to enter the wall, second time inspect it, before it is laid on the wall. this time, he shall dissignate the facing stone of the lock and aqueducts, each, by an appropriate mark; and he shall from time to time inspect it, and the cement, both common and hydraulic as the stone is laid in the wall.

16 The inspector of carpentry and lumber shall be charged with the selection and purchase of such timber, or lumber, as the President and Directors may choose to supply to the contractors, and with the inspection, before it is used, of all lumber or timber, furnished by the contractor, for any word work, and, finally, with the inspec-

tion, also, of the construction of any such work.

17. The inspectors of masonry and carpentry will receive their orders from the President and Board of Directors, the President of the company, the Engineerin Chief, or of the Members of the Board of Engineers allow ted to the particular division in which any particular work of masonry or carpentry is to be constructed; but no order of the President and Directors or of the President of the Company, or of a superior authority, will be varied or altered my the less grade, without the consent or approbation of the President and Board of Directors, or of the President of the Company, or the Superior Engineer, by whom such order may have been given. Where practicable, without delay, all order or regulations from a higher authority will descend to the agent by whom it is to be executed, through the intermediate grade or grades.

18. Every resident will be held responsible for every error, or neglect occurring within or upon his residency; and every Engineer of a division for the errors, or neglects on his division: provided, however, that no blame attach to him for necessary or mnavoidable ignorance of its occurrence, in case he make it known to the Presideat, or, in his absence, to any Director of the Company, without delay, as well as the couse of it; and moreover,

repair it, if remediable as soon as practicable.

19. All violations of omissions of duty by any of the contractors, or of their clerks, overseers, or laborers, snall be communicated to the President, or, in this absence, to a Director of the Company, who shall first perceive it, as Weil as the Resident Engineer within whose portion of the line it may have counted.

20. Every Engineer, Inspector, or other officer or a gent of the Company, is, ex officeo, an inspector of every
