That balance was paid into the Western Shore Treasury on the 8th December 1830, and is included, together with the probable receipts of the Eastern Shore Treasury in the first half and its probable disbursements in the whole of the ensuing year, in the foregoing estimate for that year. Its receipts in the other half of the year cannot reach the Western Shore Treasury until the year following. So that in considering the resources and obligations of the State with reference to that estimate, the operations of the Eastern Shore Treasury are to be wholly disregarded.
